Bruce Benson, 89, died January 29, 2014 at Hilltop Manor in Cunningham, KS. He was born October 10, 1924 at Denver, CO the son of Noah and Marguarite (Williams) Benson. On November 16, 1948 he married Jo Ann Lambert at Pratt. She survives.

Bruce was a rural mail carrier for the Pratt Post Office. He was a farmer and also had The Benson Farm Service. He served as Trustee on the Pratt Community College Board for 30 plus years. He volunteered at Pratt Regional Medical Center, and was a member of the First Christian Church in Pratt. He was involved in Rotary, Boy Scouts, Achievement Place and Community Concert.
